FOLKESTONE AND HYTHE

WALKING ROUTES TO EXPLORE



NORTH DOWNS WAY

The iconic ancient route that gives its name to the area unwinds through spectacular scenery. Start at either end and allow around six hours to walk the 15 miles between Wye and Folkestone. Train services run from both Wye and Folkestone.



LYMINGE HERITAGE TRAIL

For a shorter stroll, look no further than the Lyminge Heritage Trail. Information panels around the village and a touch screen bring the history of this charming area to life.



ELHAM VALLEY WAY

This beautiful walk stretches between Canterbury and Hythe with the majority of the path cutting through the Kent Downs National Landscape. The whole 22.5 mile path needs around 13 hours but there are many smaller parts that can be enjoyed as part of a circular walk. Elham, Lyminge and Etchinghill are all served by buses.



ROYAL KENTISH CAMINO

This 23-mile route takes you from Canterbury through the Elham Valley towards Lyminge and then Folkestone, passing through some of the most beautiful countryside in the Folkestone and Hythe area. It doesn't have to be completed in one day and there are many ancient hostleries and newer places to eat, drink and stay the night.
